









Overview:

The Gresham Parks 2035 is conducting meetings with Spanish, Russian, and Ukrainian speaking residents to assess their park and recreation needs and priorities. Verde, the City of Gresham and MIG staff conducted two in-person meetings in May. The team will meet with these same groups again in September 2024 to discuss more specific recommendations for park and recreation facility improvements.

Format:

- Presentation given by MIG staff
- Break-out small group discussions to answer questions
- Dot sticker activity to rank facilities needed and top park activities
- Large group share-out and next steps

Baseline Discussion Questions:

1. How often do you visit one of the City's parks, recreation facilities, trails or natural areas and which places do you visit most often?

3. What is missing or lacking about these facilities that you wish were there?

Summary and Key Takeaways:

The community engagement sessions held on May 2nd and 4th, 2024, provided valuable insights into local residents' use and perceptions of parks in their area. The discussions highlighted the frequent visitation of parks like Main City, Red Sunset, Nadaka, and others, with some participants visiting parks 2-3 times a week or every weekend. Participants, predominantly Spanish-speaking, emphasized their preference for parks near home or work, and some noting that they did not know the names of many parks. Favorite activities included family/social gatherings, enjoying nature, exercise and playing sports, with a preference for places that offered amenities for children, recreational activities, and natural areas.









Key areas for improvement focused on increasing safety and improved facilities in parks. Participants expressed a strong need for better lighting, more benches, additional bathrooms with adequate supplies, and increased maintenance. There were also calls for specific amenities like enclosed dog areas, sports fields, play structures, and functional water stations. Concerns about safety were prominent, with suggestions for security measures such as police presence, security cameras, and ways to call for help. There was also a desire for parks to have better infrastructure, such as sidewalks, covered areas, and separate paths for pedestrians. To continue community engagement, participants mentioned holding more meetings and a need for more inclusive communication and follow ups on progress. They also suggested a variety of platforms, including social media, local newspapers, and the radio, to keep residents informed and involved in park planning and events.






